

The pastoral epistles offer insight into how early Christians understood many practical matters, such as church administration and worship. The church's focused prayer for others is an expression of the single-minded passion God has toward us in Jesus.

¹ First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for everyone, ² for kings and all who are in high positions, so that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and dignity. ³ This is right and acceptable before God our Savior, ⁴ who desires everyone to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth. ⁵ For there is one God; there is also one mediator between God and humankind, Christ Jesus, himself human, ⁶ who gave himself a ransom for all —this was attested at the right time. ⁷ For this I was appointed a herald and an apostle (I am telling the truth; I am not lying), a teacher of the gentiles in faith and truth.



Jesus tells the curious story of a dishonest manager who cheats his employer and then is commended by him for having acted so shrewdly. Jesus wonders why his own followers are less creative and diligent in their stewardship given that they are managers of a far more valuable household.


¹ Then Jesus said to the disciples, "There was a rich man who had a manager, and charges were brought to him that this man was squandering his property. ² So he summoned him and said to him, 'What is this that I hear about you? Give me an accounting of your management because you cannot be my manager any longer.' 3 Then the manager said to himself, 'What will I do, now that my master is taking the position away from me? I am not strong enough to dig, and I am ashamed to beg. ⁴ I have decided what to do so that, when I am dismissed as manager, people may welcome me into their homes.' 5 So, summoning his master's debtors one by one, he asked the first, 'How much do you owe my master?' ⁶He answered, 'A hundred jugs of olive oil.' He said to him, 'Take your bill, sit down quickly, and make it fifty.' Then he asked another, 'And how much do you owe?' He replied, 'A hundred containers of wheat.' He said to him, 'Take your bill and make it eighty.' And his master commended the dishonest manager because he had acted shrewdly, for the children of this age are more shrewd in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light. ⁹ And I tell you, make friends for yourselves by means of dishonest wealth so that when it is gone they may welcome you into the eternal homes. ¹⁰ "Whoever is faithful in a very little is faithful also in much, and whoever is dishonest in a very little is dishonest also in much. ¹¹ If, then, you have not been faithful with the dishonest wealth, who will entrust to you the true riches? ¹² And if you have not been faithful with what belongs to another, who will give you what is


your own? ¹³ No slave can serve two masters, for a slave will either hate the one and love the other or be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and wealth."

Dear Friends in Christ,

Orphan Grain Train--Michigan continues actively engaged providing Christian care in the Name of our Lord Jesus. We extend sincere gratitude to all of you for the support of Orphan Grain Train resulting from your recent rummage / garage sale and for your continuing prayers. Thank you.

The large quantity totes containing children's clothing is especially welcomed because the need for such is evident everywhere we send relief either domestically or internationally. We have multiple photographs of children in Kyrgyzstan, Panama, Moldova, the Republic of Georgia, Latvia, Lithuania, Ukraine, Malawi, South Sudan, and Peru to which our Michigan branch has sent clothing, quilts, medical equipment, and more.

We are happy to report being able to accomplish a domestic distribution also to assist people of need in Appalachia through an outreach in Kentucky. This echoed a similar endeavor last year to Manna from Heaven in Myra, KY.

More recently we were blessed to load our second international shipment of the year. A 40-foot high cube shipping container carried 1,697 boxes of goods requested by the Lutheran Church of Lithuania to which the shipment was sent. Each shipment carries approximately fifteen tons of humanitarian goods. Among them was the unique contribution of hundreds of wash cloths sewn by your own Corrine Fraley.

We also just received word of the safe arrival of a shipment made from here at our work center in Sebewaing to a Christian women's charity in Tbilisi, the Republic of Georgia.

And on September 11 we are scheduled to load another shipment to Latvia. Thanks you all for your prayers, awareness, and support of Orphan Grain Train—Michigan. The Good Lord continues to bless us. We trust all good unfolds for you at Grace, Alpena in this Pentecost season.
