Words Matter

And how they are said, how **we say** them, matters.

Words are never just words and their meaning. They carry with them all of their usage from the past. Their history of when and how they have been used influences how society hears them today. Our personal experience of them, when and how we have heard them in the past influences how we individually hear and respond to them today. Every message of words has both content and feeling. Studies show that something like eighty percent of communication is receiving the message through the filter of our experience and life.

"The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all" has meaning because of the words and also because of our experience of those words in worship and use thorough out the history of worship and the church. The same is true of the response, "And also with you." They both carry with them feeling that adds meaning.

We need to be aware of how we receive words, our reactions to them. What meanings and feelings they carry for us. How that influences us and the message we receive. We also need to be aware of how others can receive our words because of their history and their experience of the words. We need to be caring in our use of words.

We all remember that childhood ditty, "Sticks and stones may break my bones, but words can never hurt me." And we know how wrong that is. Those emotional hurts are every bit as devastating as physical ones. And can carry wounds that stay with us a long, long time.

We as Christians need to model caring for others in society today. That includes in our communications of all forms, written and verbal. We need to be an example of caring communications that builds up others in this world. That lifts others to be the best they can be. For everyone is made in the image of God.

It is often not easy. But to be the loving and welcoming people we claim to be at Grace and as Christians, we need to take the actions that are that. And to call the world to task when it is not, saying we can be better than that.

We need to be the people we want to be in all that we do and say. We need to be the world God made us to be, wants us to be.

SEEKING VOLUNTEERS

If you are handy and can perhaps work one day a week, we'd love to hear from you.

Habitat's Mission: Seeking to put God's love into action, Habitat for Humanity brings people together to build homes, communities and hope.

Habitat's Principles: Demonstrate the love of Jesus Christ. Focus on shelter. Advocate for affordable housing. Promote dignity and hope. Support sustainable and transformative development.

Help Build a Habitat Home/Repair an Existing Home: Most Habitat volunteers join our construction crews and help build or renovate homes in Alpena, Alcona and Presque Isle counties. Our construction staff works alongside the volunteers and trains them for the tasks that are to be done that workday. Most Habitat volunteers have little or no construction experience, but they have the need to help.

Volunteer at our Habitat ReStore: The Habitat ReStore is located at 400 W Chisholm in Alpena. We are open Monday-Friday, 9 am - 5 pm and Saturday from 10 am - 3 pm. A variety of time shifts are available. We need 2-3 volunteers per day to work at the ReStore assisting the staff. Tasks include: greeting and assisting customers, pricing, moving items, display, furniture and appliance repair, painting small items, answering questions from donors, cleaning, general organizing, etc.

Volunteer in the Habitat Office: We also have opportunities at our office performing a wide range of administrative tasks. The office is open Monday - Friday from 9 am - 4 pm.

Note: There are minimum age requirements depending on job and location. Contact us for more information.


Kid's Page
