


Spiritual Friendship Saturday, May 11th ~ 10 am to 3 pm

Spring seems like it took forever to get started. And it is not fully here even now. Yet I'm already thinking of and looking forward to summer.

Talk about not living in the moment. Rather living in the anticipation and dreams of what may be coming. A sure way to miss the moment you are in and those possibilities that are all around you right now. I know that is easy enough for me to do. Always be thinking of - worrying about - the future. Missing the joy and beauty of the moment.

FROM OUR In so many ways, God is all around us everyday. And looking too far beyond the moment, we lose the possibility of seeing that. And then never do see all things God has already done around us that day.

There is a Prayer of Daily Examen, adapting the Ignatian Prayer of Daily Self-Examination, that can help us be more aware.

It's five stages are:

1) THANKSGIVING

Looking back over day give thanks, not just for those things you typically ought to give thanks for, but truly reflecting on the day look for those special occurrences of that day. Did you see giftedness in life that day? Allow gratitude to flow for those big and small events of the day. In all this, do you sense your own need?

2) ASK FOR INSIGHT

As you pray, ask for the Holy Spirit to show what you needed to see in the day.

3) LOOKING FOR GOD

In reviewing the day, intentionally look for revealing by God in the events of the day. How was God's presence offered to you that day? Were you drawn to something specific by God that day? How did you respond?

4) EXPRESSING REPENTANCE & GRATITUDE

Seek forgiveness for times you now see you were unresponsive to God's presence and love during the day. Pray for change in those things and attitudes that distances you from God. Also praise God for those times when you have experienced closeness this day.

5) RECEIVING HELP & GUIDANCE FOR TOMORROW

Ask for help for tomorrow, to overcome those actions or inactions that hindered you this day. Accept the difficulties you have in being close to God and following Jesus. Then ask for help in having greater sensitivity to when they arise tomorrow and persevering through them in that day. Ask for help in seeing God in the moment. Remembering, alone it is difficult to change. However we can ask Holy Spirit for strength and support.

May you see the blessings and giftedness of each day

I have been to six state Youth Gatherings, four in which I participated as a Peer Minister and one as Small Group Leader, one national Youth Gathering in 2015, and Camp Michi-Lu-Ca in 2014. I am a camp counselor at Camp Chickagami in Presque Isle, and in 2016 I attended a two week volunteer and faith journey session called Seminary Sampler at Trinity Lutheran Seminary in Columbus, OH. I am about to begin my application process for Candidacy to become a rostered pastor for the ELCA this summer. Sharing of the Peace

During the Easter Season at the services through the Sunday of Pentecost, we will be sharing the peace with each other as part of our service.

From ELCA Worship Resources:

Sharing God's peace is not simply offering a friendly hello to those sitting around you.

Sharing God's peace is not a time for catching up on news with your neighbor or for reminding someone about an upcoming meeting.

Sharing God's peace does not require each worshiper to offer a sign of God's peace to every other worshiper present.

The "exchange of peace" (also commonly called "sharing the peace" or "passing the peace") is an act of reconciliation that serves as a transition point between the Word and Meal portions of the liturgy.

As stated in The Sunday Assembly: The exchange of peace is a ministry, an announcement of grace we make to each other, a summary of the gift given to us in the liturgy of the Word. This ministry we do to each other is far greater than a sociable handshake or a ritual of friendship or a moment of informality. Because of the presence of Jesus Christ, we give to each other what we are saying: Christ's own peace. Then, having been gathered by the Spirit around the Risen One present in the word, we turn to celebrate his meal.

That the sharing of the peace follows the prayers of the church is not accidental. Having been forged into a common people in Holy Baptism, the congregation prays for peace in the Church, peace in the world, and peace for all those in need. Then the congregation follows through with the people offering peace and reconciliation to one another. This is not human peace alone, but the peace which is possible only through Christ. Then, after the exchange of peace, we receive the gift of Christ's peace in our sharing Holy Communion.

In some assemblies, worshippers simply turn to those sitting nearby and offer a handshake with the words "peace be with you" or "the peace of Christ be with you." Conscious that some may not wish to shake hands, take your cue from the other person. It is appropriate to simply offer each other the words of peace.




