Our Sunday mornings Adult Christian Education (ACE) class finished up our series Dialogue On: Sexuality in August, a curriculum that came from the ELCA publishing house Augsburg Fortress. The format is to pair techniques for having difficult and sensitive conversations with a topic that is tough to talk about. This is the second Dialogue On curriculum series we have done. The first being Dialogue On: Refugees. We expected this one to cover issues of sexuality that are issues in the church today. What most of us were surprised to discover was the range of topics that it covered: from heterosexuality, patriarchy and sexism to homosexuality and transgender issues. I believe all in the class felt they learned from the seven sessions of the series. The class felt it was a sufficiently informative series that it should

DIALOGUES ON SEXUALITY seemed a daunting title for an ACE topic, one that gave me pause and threatened my comfort zone. How much would I be willing to participate?

Fortunately I joined this group for our seven week study on the complexity of varied human sexuality. The text, the video and the discussions each Sunday morning disrupted my equilibrium to varying degrees. I came away with new insights and challenges to consider as I work to follow the teachings of my faith.

This book study helped me to realize that sexism exists within the church and the patriarchy that is so widespread and taken for granted. I became aware of my own "unconscious" bias. I realized that I exclude myself from situations based on my gender and I get excluded from situations because of my gender.

I came to better understand the pain, shame, fear and struggle that Christian men and women face when they are something other than straight. I learned that I want my church to be a safe place and I learned there is work to be done.

I invite you to join in the series when it is offered again next year. Talk to those who participated to get a greater sense of the class and hear from them directly why they felt it was valuable for them personally. One neat thing we were able to do with Augsberg Fortress' permission is place the weekly videos online so they could be viewed even if the class was missed. That helped people have the same information as we moved forward even if not every class could be attended.



Can you name these biblical grandparents? If you get stuck, find an Old Testament family tree in your Bible or online.


