
Dirty Copper for the NRN Mission Trip

Trip to Poland by Alecia Lewis FUNDRAISING EFFORT

At the end of May I will be joining a team of 14 volunteers traveling to Gliwice, Poland with Habitat for Humanity. While our team is in Poland we will be renovating a family's home to assist with the housing shortage there. Poland has one of the worst housing situations in Europe. About 15% of the population live in substandard housing with no sewage or adequate heating systems. Approximately 5 million people live below the poverty line and Poland is the only country in Europe with less than one room per person.

I am asking for donations to assist with the expenses of the trip. My fundraising goal is \$1750. The funds will be used to pay for lodging, meals, and transportation to and from the job site each day while in Poland. Money raised above the cost of in-country expenses will be split between the Habitat affiliate in Poland and Habitat in the US to help keep their programs going in the future.

SHAVING CREAM EARTH


God created this wonderful world and told us to care for it. Remember that by making a unique painting.

What you need: \


- A cookie sheet
- White shaving cream
- A wooden craft stick
- Paint (blue and green)
- A straw
- A paper plate

What you do:

- 1. On the cookie sheet, spray shaving cream in a circle (the same size as the bottom of the paper plate). Smooth it out with the craft stick.
- 2. Squirt the blue and green paint on top of the shaving cream in loopy, squiggly patterns. Swirl the paint around with the straw.
- 3. Place the bottom of the paper plate on top of the paint. Press it down gently so the whole plate bottom is covered in paint.
- 4. Lift up the plate and gently remove excess shaving cream with the stick.
- 5. After the painting dries, hang it on your wall.


