Occupation: Retired and now a full-time grandmother


<u>Hobbies/Interests</u>: My kids and grand kids. Reading. Knitting and crocheting. My dogs.



# Martin Luther King, Jr. Celebration Day announces Its Youth Essay Contest

Essay entries will be divided into two groups, grades 6-8, and grades 9-12.

The essay prizes will be \$100 for first place and \$75 for second place for each group.

The winners will be asked to read their essays on Monday, January 15, 2018 as part of the Martin Luther King, Jr. Celebration Day event at 6:30 p.m. at the ACC Granum Theatre. The community will be invited to share in this event.

#### Guidelines

- Essays for grades 6-8 must be from 300-500 words.
- Essays for grades 9-12 must be from 500-800 words.
- The essay question to be addressed is "Martin Luther King, Jr. was known for working for equal rights for all using non-violent methods. Using examples from current events, why is Dr. King's message still important today? How can we honor his message of equal rights for all today?"
- All essays must be an original work.
- All essays must be formatted as a WORD document attached to an email message. Send essays to <a href="mailto:mlkjralpena@gmail.com">mlkjralpena@gmail.com</a>
- Entries must be clearly labeled with the:
  - author's full name, age, grade in school, name of school mailing address, phone number, and word count.
- All essays must be submitted by <u>Friday</u>, <u>December 22</u>, <u>2017</u>.
- Winners will be contacted by <u>Monday</u>, <u>January 8</u>, <u>2018</u>.

Essays will be judged by the Martin Luther King, Jr. Day Committee for the Alpena Area. In order to have a valid Essay Contest, we need a minimum of 20 qualified submissions for each group (grades 6-8 and grades 9-12).

## POP-UP (ARD)

Share the good news of Jesus' birth with this creative Christmas card.

#### What you need:

- Construction paper (two pieces, including one white)
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Pens
- Glue stick



#### What you do:

- 1. Neatly fold the white paper in half, short side to short side.
- 2. Draw two parallel lines (at least 2 inches apart) from the fold to about halfway to the edge. Cut along the lines.
- 3. Fold the cut section back and forth so it pops up.
- 4. Push the section up so it pops up inside the folded paper. Draw a nativity scene on the pop-up box.
- 5. Fold the colored paper in half, short side to short side. Place the white paper inside it and glue the white paper down, being careful not to glue the pop-up box.
- 6. Write a Christmas message and give or send the card to someone.
