With the adoption of the Purpose Statement and Guiding Principles at the Special Congregational Meeting on August 7th, our challenge now is to live them out in the life of Grace Lutheran and the things we do. We hold them as our guide and our criteria for making decisions for what goes on at Grace in the future. This is not cut and dried. We still need to be open to the Spirit's

moving, as we were at the Special Congregatigonal meeting when a modification in wording was proposed and the members felt that it was the right expression of what we want to be and do.

We will be seeing and hear the Statement and Principles repeatedly in the days and months to come, not only for each of us to become familiar with them but for us to use them as a guide for everything we do.

Already we have a great example of this happening at Grace. Last spring, Corinne Fraley's daughter, Erin, asked her to save plastic bags for a project being done by the National Honor Society in Three Rivers, MI, (where Erin lives). These bags were being used to make mats for the homeless shelters in Kalamazoo, MI. and Muskegon. MI. Corinne began saving them and shared the story with others. She showed some members at Grace how to make the mats (it takes 700 bags for 1 mat and each mat is 6'X4'). Pam Kirchoff was so interested she went to Walmart and Meijer, showed them what she was doing and asked if she could have their recycled bags for this project; they were happy to help out. Pam said that whenever she goes to either store for more bags, someone always asks her what she's doing so she tells them about the project.

One of Corinne's neighbors who is a member of Trinity Episcopal was interested and asked Corinne to come show their members how to make the mats. Another member of Trinity who has a Girl Scout troop is interested in having her troop take this on as a project too. The project has snowballed with all sorts of possibilities here in Alpena "making a Christ-like difference in our community and world."

Corinne and Pam are willing to share with others how to cut the bags, make plarn (plastic yarn) or crochet the mats. They have a step-by-step process display in the front narthex. Others at Grace have gotten involved and are part of the process for the mats. You can be too.

A seed planted by Corinne's daughter has sprouted here in Alpena starting at Grace—who knows how many mats will be made and sent from Alpena. This is exactly how the Holy Spirit works and what a perfect example of "making a Christ-like difference in our community and world".

Lets explore living out our Purpose Statement and Guiding Principles together as we do our part for building God's Kingdom of love, justice and grace here and now.


BREAD WEEKEND continues to be successful and is held the 3rd weekend of the month. The August amount was \$212. Money collected is sent to ELCA World Hunger.







What you need:

- A large round bowl

- 6. Rotate the circle to a new blank space, and write another fear and verse.




PROTECT
