Greetings from Columbus! Now that I am more settled into my new place and routine, I wanted to give you all an update on what is going on in my life.

First of all, thank you SO MUCH for your gifts. I have already drunk a lot at Starbucks and I'm barely into my third week. Thank you all so much for a beautiful send off a few weeks ago. I feel blessed to call Grace Lutheran my home congregation.

Which brings me to tell you about my new home here in Columbus! At first, I was very nervous to move to a large city and live by myself. I was worried about making friends and finding my way around. Sure enough, I was wrong. I have already made friends whom I hang out with almost on a daily basis. Most of the young adults in my cohort all live in the same on campus apartment building with me. The first-year cohort I am in is only 13 people, so all of my classes are with the same people more or less with second-year cohort students. I have also been out exploring Columbus a bit with them. There are some great Farmer's Markets and Restaurants in the city. I have yet to explore the museums, but am looking forward to an outing with my cohort to one in the near future!

Dr. Wrenn makes learning about the Old Testament interesting. She is extremely insightful and fosters reading the Old Testament in different lenses to better fully understand what is being said. I am excited to continue learning.

I would like to write to you all more about what I am learning in my classes. I would like to give you all a quick summary of something I am learning, a snapshot of what I am doing in a class and how I feel about it. I am planning to write these snapshots once or twice a month starting in October.
