I know many have enjoyed the extra days of warmth. And I have too, well except for the warm nights. It is fall after all, at least I think. And there are signs of it. I speak often of the Kingdom of God, and I do it because I think the Bible, particularly the Gospels, talk of it. For me it is the already Kingdom God has established, but it is certainly not complete or living as God would wish. The in-breaking, the hints are around us. The full beauty of it is not yet known. The promise is in the air, like the sightings of red and yellow leaves on the trees that are still predominantly green.

Sometimes we must look harder than other times to get the glimpse of the Kingdom. Just as we see a few leaves and hope to see the whole tree ablaze when we go back for another look. That takes the effort to remember the tree and its location and then fit that trip into our schedule.

Well that is part of it, looking again and again. God has promised the Kingdom of peace, love and grace. And it will come about because that is God's promise, and as Luther says, our prayer is that it come to us also. I want to suggest the faith practices of prayer, scripture study, devotional reading, stewardship giving, worship and serving help us to see where the Kingdom is happening. They help us learn to look, take the time and see more clearly. Faith is given to us by God through the Holy Spirit. Faith growth, our discipleship, our realization of faith, comes as we practice our faith through some vary concrete steps.

May you be blessed with a feast for the eyes in the beauty of fall color and for the soul with views of the Kingdom


Make these practical gifts to share blessings with homeless people and others in need.
