


We welcome Ella Grace and Kady Rayne Sandula to the Baptism Lord's family.Ella and Kady were baptized on Saturday,

This year Charles Snyder and Linda Batchelor accompanied Pastor to the Synod Assembly held in Grand Rapids. It was a first time experience for Charles and Linda and they recommend others try it. Besides the fellowship and good food

they were able to take part in an event on Monday afternoon.

Charles went on a field trip to a homeless shelter. It is funded by five churches and various organizations in the community. He was impressed at how well it was managed. They offer different shelters for men and women and have house trailers to house families.

Linda spent the afternoon in a prayer workshop. Time was spent learning how to focus on prayer without letting your mind drift. The afternoon ended with communion.

In the business meeting the most important item discussed was the new budget. It was voted on and approved to increase the Synod's budget. Each church is expected to send 7% next year and 13% the following year. After 2009, the Synod decreased the staff and with this increase they will be able to increase the staff to what it was in 2009. Half of what we send goes to ELCA to help pay expenses and contribute to their charities.

Linda and Charles were grateful for the chance to represent Grace at the Assembly.



Questions

Why the changing of the Lord's Prayer, as during Lent?

During Lent, we used what is known as the ecumenical version of the Lord's Prayer. This one uses "forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us" rather than "forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us."

There of course have been the two traditional variations, debts and trespasses. And of course I grew up with the "right" version, debts. © But that never made sense to me as debts sounded so economic or financial. Nor did trespasses with that sounding so much about property.

Sins is a more recent translation that grew out of the work International Consultation on English Texts, a commission of many churches working together across denominational lines to update prayers and liturgy in English-speaking churches. I suspect if we asked the youth of today which version just makes sense to them, "sins" would have a sizeable response.

Debts was used in many historical versions of the prayer and biblical translations such as Wycliffe in 1389 and the King James Version in 1611. Trespasses was also used in many historic versions and traditions. Yet as with many words, the predominant contemporary meaning has changed over the centuries. I still remember my Old Testament Professor from seminary talking about the "hosts" of angels sounding like angels serving hors d'oeuvres rather than it historical meaning of armies.

If we look in the Lutheran Study Bible at the verses where the prayer occurs in Matthew 6:9 and following it's debts and debtors and Luke 11:2 and following it's sins and indebted.

In our current red hymnal, Evangelical Lutheran Worship, and even in the prior green hymnal, the Lutheran Book of Worship, "forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us" is the first option listed, and thus the recommended.

Just because some thing is new or the recommended option doesn't mean it has to be used. I have personally found though that different words on occasion, like different translations of the Bible, makes me pause and really consider what I am saying rather than just repeating almost unconsciously what I know. Some times enough to hear with new ears and just maybe, just maybe, a new word and emphasis for me.

Blessings on your hearing of God's word. May it be life giving for you.

Another precious child, Ishimwe Kevine Umulisa from Rwanda has been waiting and hoping for a sponsor. World Vision says "We've selected her especially for you because of the faithful commitment you've shown to building a better world for children". Ishimwe is a 10 year old girl who is in primary school and loves to play ball. She lives with her mom and has no brothers or sisters. She is growing up in a very poor area in Rwanda. The HIV and AIDS crisis has severely damaged the social fabric of entire communities, leaving many children without parents. Typically, families live in mud brick homes with tin or thatched roofs. In most areas the terrain is mountainous and green with a humid climate.

Our sponsorship commitment will help provide Ishimwe and her community with better health through training in nutrition and disease prevention, as well as access to water for washing. Children will benefit from new classrooms, desks, and better-trained teachers. And through our partnership with local churches, Ishimwe and other children will learn about the surpassing love of Jesus Christ.

Any brand of plastic drinking cups.

Examples, Solo Cups, fast food restaurant cups, etc.





Diaper Packaging

All diaper and wipe

packaging. Any brand.





Lunch Kits

Any brand or size of disposable lunch kits. Examples, Lunchables.



Cereal Bags


All brands.



Paired Shoes

Pairs of women's, men's, and children's shoes, which may include athletic sneakers, fashion or casual sneakers, dress shoes, flats, high heels, boots, and cleats.





What you need:

- White construction paper (11" x 13" sheet)
