LENT L'entlent L'ent

I have 2 stories to tell you, of pews and a car ride.

It was mentioned that the pews were a bit squeaky. A crew looked at the pews, thought of a few things to consider and discovered more and more issues that needed to be addressed. With a plan and then a test, they began the project.

Well you should have seen the sanctuary. Pews unscrewed from the floor and pushed together for working space, tarps spread out, pews turned over on saw horses, new screws put into the seats along the bottom of the backs, repairs being done and braces being cut and glued and screwed in place. It was an absolute hive of activity. It was nearly 2 weeks of work getting this project done to reduce those squeaks and as a result stabilizing and strengthening the pews.

If you were in the church 1 of the two weekends we tested out the results, you were astounded at the how quiet it was standing up and sitting down.

Along the way a few labels were found, from the manufacturer of 128 years ago, Church Furniture Manufacturer of Findlay Ohio with a signature of ?? owner or foreman or carpenter. A bit of history. And a bit of history made for future generations too, when they do any repairs in another 128 years or so.

The really neat and gratifying thing for our church community was how a group came together with the time, talent and resources (including wood from Alpena) to tackle the problem and it was done. And judging from the conversations I heard during the process a good time was had by all.

On the car ride, I received a call needing help with a visit to Flint for a doctor's appointment. Just two days before the planned visit, the scheduled transportation did not work out due to a change with that driver's schedule. I called a number of you and with such short notice it wasn't possible for many **this time**. What was gratifying, was how many said keep them in mind for future needs. The trip was made and it was an extraordinary help. Thank you.

It was gratifying to see the response that came for the needs, in the building itself and for something outside. There are many more stories that could be told of working for building up God's Kingdom, these are just two in my mind right now.

Indeed THANK YOU ALL for the many ways, big and small, known and unknown, every week and once it a while that you give something for the work of the church. There are many ways to make a difference, welcome all and share God's love.

Thank you for being a blessing for God's Kingdom.



# PRAYER HANDS

Make these hands as a helpful prayer guide.





#### What you need:

- 7 pieces of construction paper (different colors)
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Stapler
- Colored pens
- Stickers

#### What you do:

- 1. Trace your hand (the same one) on each piece of paper.
- 2. Cut out and stack the hands. Staple together atop the pinky.
- 3. On the top hand (the front cover), write "Prayer Hands." Decorate with stickers.
- 4. On the second hand, write "Praise God." On the third, write "Ask for forgiveness." On the fourth, write "Thank God." On the fifth, write "Pray for others." On the sixth, write "Pray for me."
